

Same Gun Used in Three Shootings

WHITE PLAINS, May 31—The police of the Westchester County town of Greenburgh said today that ballistic tests indicated that the same weapon, a .32-caliber handgun, was used in three shootings into private homes or apartments Monday night.

Only one person was wounded, a 17-year-old high school senior who was shot in a shoulder as she watched television shortly after 1 A.M. in her home at 11 Whitehouse Lane. The police have determined that the three shots fired at the girl were discharged from just outside her bedroom window.

The other shootings took place less than two hours before that one, and all within two miles.

The wounded girl, Lisa Gottlieb, was discharged today following her hospitalization at the County Medical Center in Valhalla.

"It's very frightening," the girl's stepfather, Barry Littman, an apparel executive, said today.

"We were all asleep," he said. "About 1 o'clock, I heard three shots. My wife thought they were fireworks."

While Mr. Littman and his wife, Marilyn, discussed the source of the noises they had heard from their second-floor bedroom, their bedroom phone rang. "It was our daughter calling us on her phone to tell us that someone had shot her."

The police said that they were following leads, but had no clues to the identity of the attacker, who had earlier fired through a wall of a second-floor apartment on Hillside Avenue, where a party was in progress, and through a picture window of a living room of a private house on West Primrose Avenue, where two persons were seated.

Capt. John Hahn of the Greenburgh police, said his investigators had not as yet linked the shootings to two other sniping attacks in the county. A still-uncaught "dart sniper" injured 22 women in separate incidents in Greenburgh and other communities last year in nighttime attacks using what police believe was an air gun and steel-tipped darts.

Recently, a sniper fired at two motorists driving along the Bronx River Parkway. There were no injuries in the Parkway incidents.
