## A 2d \$10 Million Suit Calls Police In Yonkers Negligent in "Sam" Case

YONKERS, Sept. 21 (AP)—Notice of a second \$10 million negligence suit against the Yonkers police has been filed by Robert Violante, wounded and left partially blind when he and Stacy Moskowitz were shot July 31, the last victims of the .44-caliber killer. Miss Moskowitz died.

The first \$10-million suit was filed a month ago by the Moskowitz family, which contended that the Yonkers police had enough information as early as April

to suspect David R. Berkowitz was the "Son of Sam" killer.

Mr. Berkowitz, 24 years old, has been charged with six killings and seven woundings that terrorized the city for a year.

In question is whether the Yonkers police failed to pursue a series of bizarre events—including a fire-bombing, the shooting of a dog and letter threats—the Yonkers neighborhood where Mr. Berkowitz lived.

William Polsen, the Yonkers Police Chief, has ordered silence about the case within Police Department ranks on the ground that lawsuits against the city were pending.
