Bruised Actress Taken Off L.I. Train

Melonie Haller, an actress who appeared on the "Welcome Back Kotter" television series, was found yesterday morning badly bruised and seeming incoherent on a Long Island Rail Road train, according to the Suffolk County police.

Miss Haller, who was returning to New York from a weekend stay at the 66-room Southampton oceanfront home of Roy Radin, a theatrical producer and talent manager, was taken off the train in Patchogue, L.I., and driven by ambulance to Brookhaven Memorial Hospital after a conductor had become concerned by her apparently groggy condition.

Sgt. William Gilpin of the Suffolk County police said Miss Haller, 23 years

old, "had been incoherent when taken to the hospital, but she did say she had been assaulted." Sergeant Gilpin added that an examination at the hospital found the actress to be "badly bruised." Officials at the Brookhaven hospital last night refused to comment on Miss Haller's condition.

Lawrence Hirsch, an attorney for Mr. Radin, said: "Mr. Radin is unaware of any attack on Miss Haller. All Mr. Radin knows is that a member of his staff found Miss Haller at the bottom of the stairs. Apparently she had too much to drink and had taken a fall. She asked to be put on a train and someone drove her to the station."
