'Son of Sam' Adds Four Names In New Letter, Police Disclose

The police have released part of a second letter from "Son of Sam" in the hope that it may help them find the man who used a .44-caliber pistol to murder five people in the Bronx and Queens.

The writer of the letter included four nicknames in addition to "Son of Sam." They were "the Duke of Death," "the Wicked King Wicker," "the Twenty-Two Disciples of Hell" and "John 'Wheaties'—Rapist and Suffocater of Young Girls."

The letter warns that there will probably be more slayings because of a compulsion to kill. "I am still here," it says. "Like a spirit roaming the night . . . I will see you at the next job. Or, should I say you will see my handiwork at the next job?"

The police noted that all the words in the letter were correctly spelled, that it was properly punctuated and that it was printed in a highly stylized manner, as if by a draftsman or cartoonist. The police asked that anyone who might have any information on the letter or slayings to call them at 961-9613.
