

Four Newsmen Freed Without Bail On Yonkers Trespassing Charges

YONKERS, Aug. 12 (UPI)—Four newsmen were arraigned here today on charges of criminal trespass for allegedly breaking into the apartment of David Berkowitz, who the police say is the .44-caliber killer.

Judge Robert Cacace of City Court freed them without bail and ordered them to return Sept. 12. If convicted they could be imprisoned for one year and fined \$1,000.

The newsmen charged were David Berliner, a reporter for The Washington Post, Leonard Detrick of The Daily News, Theodore Cowell of Time magazine and Robert Kalfus of The New York Post, all photographers.

The four were allegedly discovered in the seventh-floor studio apartment about 3 P.M. yesterday by the Yonkers police. The police said the door's three locks were secure and speculated that the men might have entered through a window opening onto a fire escape.
