

Actress Who Alleged Rape on L.I. Claims Drugging in Another Case

Melonie Haller, the actress who told authorities that she was raped at a party in a Southampton, L.I., mansion last month, was released from Mount Sinai Hospital yesterday morning, 22 hours after she was admitted to its emergency room contending a man had forcibly injected her with drugs, the police said.

A detective said Miss Haller had told a friend that a man had forced narcotics on her in an apartment in the West 20's in Manhattan. The detective said the police had questioned the man and hoped to question Miss Haller.

Adam Henick, an administrative officer at the hospital, would only say that Miss Haller had been admitted and then released from Mount Sinai. The police said the hospital had not yet confirmed that there were drugs in Miss Haller's system.

A Suffolk County grand jury is investigating charges that Miss Haller was raped at a party in Southampton last month. Miss Haller has said that she was assaulted by two men and two women, and raped by a third man, during a party on April 12 at the 66-room, ocean-front home of Roy Radin, a theatrical producer.
